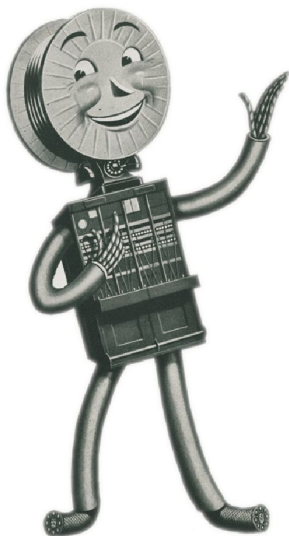

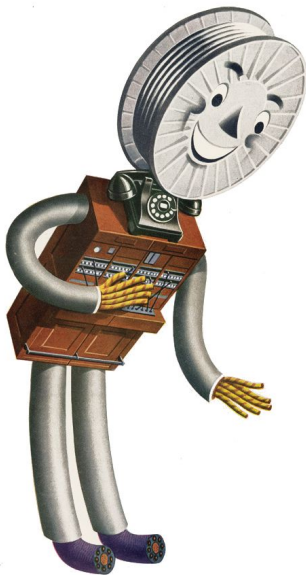

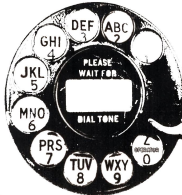

HOW TO DIAL

Seven-digit dialing is a telephone dialing procedure that used the location of the telephone exchange (as letters) and the number to be dialed. You might see a number "Hershey 6-500" would be dialed as 4 for "H" and 3 for "E", making 436-500.



Use your finger to rotate the dial until your finger hits the silver finger stopper.

Operator! The Spirit of Service That Keeps on Going

In the past, telephone exchanges were manually operated by operators and telephone numbers were typically 2-4 digits long. As more people got telephones, multiple exchanges were created to serve different areas, with names and numbers used to identify them. To transition from manual to automatic systems, various numbering schemes were developed. Larger cities used a 2L+4N format and the four biggest cities used seven dial pulls. Rural areas often had party lines with up to four digits plus a letter or combination to identify the desired party.

Today, VinTEL gives the experience of interacting with a vintage telephone just like they did in the old days.
